Demonstration sports of Acrobatics Gymnastics and Synchronised Trampoline will be conducted according to the competition rules published within this Bulletin.

Men's Gymnastics

A team of 6, with a maximum of 3 Senior gymnasts
Top 8 Juniors and Top 8 Seniors in each division will
qualify for Apparatus Finals with a limit of two per
country in division.

Women's Gymnastics

Team / All-Around
Apparatus Finals

A team of 6, with a maximum of 3 Senior gymnasts
Top 8 Juniors and Top 8 Seniors in division will
qualify for Apparatus Finals with a limit of two per
country in each division.

Rhythmic Gymnastics

Team / All-Around
Apparatus Finals

A team of 6, with a maximum of 3 Senior gymnasts
Top 8 Juniors and Top 8 Seniors in division will
qualify for Apparatus Finals with a limit of two per
country in each division.

Group

Group of 6 gymnasts with junior age gymnasts
allowed to form part of Senior Group.
A minimum of three entries must be received to have
a Group competition.

Trampoline (Men/Women)

Team

A team consists of 4 gymnasts (2 Senior & 2 Junior)
both for the Men's and Women's competition.

Individual

A maximum of eight (8) gymnasts per gender (Men
and Women) per division (Snr and Jnr) progress
through to finals.

Synchronised Trampoline*

Men's SYN – Senior (Qualification/Final)
Men's SYN – Junior (Qualification/Final)
Women's SYN – Senior (Qualification/Final)
Women's SYN – Junior (Qualification/Final)

* At least one trampoline athlete in each synchronised pair must come from the individual trampoline entries.



Acrobatics Gymnastics

Senior Mixed pairs

Max two pairs per Federation

Senior Women's Group (Women's Trio)

Max two groups per Federation

All Groups or Pairs will perform three exercises: Balance, Dynamic and Combined. It is an All Around event with no final.

Difficulty requirements: The difficulty for Combined will be 180 as per the Qualification Combined conversion chart.

7. AGE REQUIREMENTS

The age requirements are as per PANGF Technical Regulations:

Trampoline Men/Women (Senior)	Minimum, turning 17 years of age in the year of the competition

Acrobatics Gymnastics (Mixed pair/Women's group)	Minimum, turning 14 years of age in the year of the competition

The Pacific Rim Organising Committee will request copies of passports at the time of accreditation.



8. JUDGES

Every participating PANGF Member Federation must register one (1) FIG judge per discipline and can have a maximum of three (3) judges per discipline.

The balance of the judges may be supplied by the Host Federation. There may be no more than (1) judge from each Federation on each apparatus. The final decision will be taken by the Technical Coordinator in consultation with the Executive to ensure the integrity of the panels is retained.

The fine for not supplying one (1) judge per discipline will be US\$1000 for each discipline. The fine income will be used to cover the cost of travel and accommodation for additional judges, as appointed by the PANGF EC to officiate at the event.

9. ENTRIES / REGISTRATIONS

Entries can only be made by PANGF Member Federations. The deadlines for the entries are as follows:

Provisional entries:	11th December 2009
Definitive entries: (50% Accommodation payment)	12th February 2010
Nominative entries: (Accommodation balance of payment)	12th March 2010

10. COMPETITION DRAW

The draw for the competition will take place at least one month prior to competition and will be attended by a PANGF Executive representative, Organising Committee Chairperson, and the Organizing Committee Competition Director.

The draw for order of competition will be according to FIG rules.

An official event workplan will be distributed, published on the Gymnastics Australia website and sent to participating Federations with results of the competition draw and a detailed training schedule.

11. EQUIPMENT

12. FAREWELL FUNCTION

The Official Farewell Banquet will be held at the ANZ Pavilion at The Victorian Arts Centre on Sunday night, 2nd May. This venue is in the centre of the city and within walking distance to the Official Championship Hotels.

13. VISA REQUIREMENTS

Some countries may require visas for entering Australia. PANGF member federations should check with their travel organizer to ensure visa requirements are met. On request, Gymnastics Australia will provide PANGF Member Federations with an official letter of invitation where required.

14. INSURANCE

The FIG Technical Regulations foresee that all participating Federations are responsible for having the necessary insurance coverage against accidents and illness for all participants.

Delegations must verify proof of group medical insurance (a cover note or photocopy of the policy) with the Organizing Committee at accreditation. For delegations which do not have proof of insurance, GA will provide appropriate insurance coverage that must be purchased at accreditation.

15. DOPING CONTROLS

This event will be conducted under the FIG Doping controls as per WADA and the Australian Sports Anti Doping Authority (ASADA).

(ii) BREAKFAST & THE MEAL PLAN

When booking your flights into Melbourne, where possible, please take this into consideration as an afternoon arrival will ensure immediate availability. For morning arrivals, if you feel it necessary, you can ensure immediate availability by paying the extra day's tariff and book rooms for the night before arrival. If you take this precaution, please advise Gymnastics Australia accordingly so that the hotel knows that the rooms are "pre-registered". Check-out time at most hotels is 11:00am.

(v) AIRPORT AND CHAMPIONSHIP TRANSPORTATION

Member Federations staying at one of the Official Championship Hotels will be provided with a comprehensive event, training and airport transport service.

The airport transfer service will commence from Monday 26 April 2010 and conclude Monday 3 May 2010. The training and event transport service will commence from Tuesday 27th April and conclude Sunday 2nd May.

A deposit equal to fifty percent (50%) of the total accommodation package per person will be required for your delegation by Friday 12th February 2010. This payment is non-refundable.

Final Payment:

Final payment for all accommodation packages will be required by Friday 12th March 2010. This payment is also non-refundable.
